Excerpt from MCCMC By-Laws related to City Selection Committee, as amended March 2018:

ARTICLE V

Committees/Authority Assignments

Section 1. Standing Committees:

- a. <u>Legislative Committee</u>: The Legislative Committee shall consist of a Councilmember from each of the member cities, chosen by their respective City Councils, one city manager and one alternate city manager. Its duties shall be to review pending Federal and State legislation affecting cities and to take a position on the legislation consistent with a vote of the majority of the committee and the authority given the committee by MCCMC policies.
- b. <u>Executive Committee</u>: The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President and the most immediate Past-President who is a member. It shall serve in an advisory capacity to the President to help plan and organize the activities of the COUNCIL.
- Mayors Select Committee: The Mayors Select Committee shall consist of the Mayor, or C. his/her designated representative from among each member's council, from each of the member cities and the Executive Committee of MCCMC. Its duties will be to form a consensus on and a recommended advocacy action for citywide and/or regional issues that directly and immediately affect all member cities and for which there is no other appropriate forum. The Mayors Select Committee shall also perform the functions of the City Selection Committee (relating to certain appointments and nominations) and under the powers vested by and pursuant to Cal. Gov't Code §50270 et seq. The Mayors Select Committee shall meet annually in April or at the first reasonably convenient time thereafter, and its Chair will be the President of MCCMC. Executive Committee members may be present but may not cast votes on City Selection Committee matters except when designated as described above. The President of MCCMC will report on the actions or recommendations of the Mayors Select Committee at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the COUNCIL, and shall call for a full vote of any recommended advocacy actions.

governed by Government Code Section 30301.2. The letter of request from the Senate Rules

Committee was included in the agenda packet. The relevant part of the government code section

reads: "In regions composed of three counties, the Board of Supervisors and the City Selection

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Committee in each county within the region shall each nominate one or more Supervisors and one or more mayors or city council members. Secretary Vaughn reported that, in speaking with staff at the Senate Rules Committee, it was confirmed that the Committee was expecting to receive nominations from both the Board of Supervisors and the City Selection Committee. The Committee will interview all nominees received.

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President Withy explained the ballot that was distributed to the Mayors/proxies. It has one section for listing one or more members of the Board of Supervisors and another section for listing the names of one or more mayors or councilmembers. He stated that three letters of interest were received from: Supervisor Katie Rice, Supervisor Dennis Rodoni and Larkspur Councilmember Kevin Haroff. The Executive Committee has taken the position that any name that appears on any of the ballots will be submitted to the Senate Rules Committee for Consideration.

4.2: Opportunity for candidates to provide brief statements to the Committee, if they wish

Supervisors Rice and Rodoni could not be present.

Councilmember Haroff provided a brief statement to the City Selection Committee regarding his qualifications and interest in the appointment and encouraged the group to read the letter and attachments submitted and included with the agenda packet.

4.3: Comments from MCCMC members and other members of the public

Sloan Bailey, Corte Madera Councilmember and designated proxy for Corte Madera, spoke about the recent history of the California Coastal Commission North Coast Seat appointment, and the process that took place after Steve Kinsey stepped down two and a half years ago. He stated that this is a critically important and powerful committee that is indispensable in determining the future of our coastline, the overwhelming portion of which is Marin.

4.4: Mayors/Proxies discussion and nominations by ballot

There was no discussion requested by the Mayors and proxies. President Withy called for the vote and asked that the ballots be distributed. Following completion, they were collected and then tabulated by Secretary Vaughn. Following review of the ballots, it was announced that the names of Supervisor Katie Rice, Supervisor Dennis Rodoni and Larkspur Council member Kevin Haroff would be submitted to the Senate Rules Committee for consideration.
