Excerpt from MCCMC By-Laws related to City Selection Committee, as amended March 2018:

## ARTICLE V

#### Committees/Authority Assignments

Section 1. Standing Committees:

- a. <u>Legislative Committee</u>: The Legislative Committee shall consist of a Councilmember from each of the member cities, chosen by their respective City Councils, one city manager and one alternate city manager. Its duties shall be to review pending Federal and State legislation affecting cities and to take a position on the legislation consistent with a vote of the majority of the committee and the authority given the committee by MCCMC policies.
- b. <u>Executive Committee</u>: The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President and the most immediate Past-President who is a member. It shall serve in an advisory capacity to the President to help plan and organize the activities of the COUNCIL.
- c. <u>Mayors Select Committee</u>: The Mayors Select Committee shall consist of the Mayor, or his/her designated representative from among each member's council, from each of the member cities and the Executive Committee of MCCMC. Its duties will be to form a consensus on and a recommended advocacy action for citywide and/or regional issues that directly and immediately affect all member cities and for which there is no other appropriate forum. The Mayors Select Committee shall also perform the functions of the City Selection Committee (relating to certain appointments and nominations) and under the powers vested by and pursuant to Cal. Gov't Code §50270 et seq. The Mayors Select Committee shall meet annually in April

or at the first reasonably convenient time thereafter, and its Chair will be the President of MCCMC. Executive Committee members may be present but may not cast votes on City Selection Committee matters except when designated as described above. The President of MCCMC will report on the actions or recommendations of the Mayors Select Committee at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the COUNCIL, and shall call for a full vote of any recommended advocacy actions.

36 President Colbert introduced the item. There was no public comment and no questions from the Mayors in attendance. There was a motion and a second (Blaustein/Paulson) to accept the minutes of the October 26, 38 2022 City Selection Committee meeting. The motion was unanimously approved by a roll call vote of the 39 Mayors of the cities/towns present, 8-0-2-1 (Belvedere and Tiburon absent, San Rafael abstained) 40

#### 4. Consideration and Possible Action to Nominate Three (3) Persons to the Marin County Board of Supervisors for Consideration for Appointment to Represent the County of Marin on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) to serve a 4-year term on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission

1. Introduction

47 President Colbert introduced the item, explaining that an announcement of expiration of current term was 48 made, and letters of interest solicited, at the October 26, 2022 Marin County Council of Mayors and 49 Councilmembers meeting, and a public notice was posted on the MCCMC website and emailed to Marin 50 Councilmembers and Supervisors. The City Selection Committee may consider nominating up to three 51 applicants to the Marin County Board of Supervisors for consideration and appointment to serve as the 52 County's representative to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission. A letter of interest was received 53 from Supervisor Stephanie Moulton-Peters. No letters of interest were received.

There was a motion and a second (Colin/Burdo) to nominate Stephanie Moulton-Peters, Marin County Supervisor, District 3, to the Marin County Board of Supervisors for consideration and possible appointment to serve as the County of Marin's representative to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission. During the ballot process, two other nominations were received, for Kate Colin, San Rafael (nominated by Mill Valley) and Kevin Carroll, Larkspur (nominated by Larkspur). Both nominees declined the nomination and the vote proceeded. The motion was unanimously approved by a ballot vote conducted via zoom chat of the Mayors (or their designated proxies) of the cities/towns present, 9-0-2 (Belvedere and Tiburon absent).

Dear Marin Council of Mayors and Council Members: October 16, 2023

I respectfully ask for your support to continue to serve as your representative to the Golden Gate Bridge, Highway and Transportation District Board (GGBHTD). I have submitted regular monthly updates since my appointment, but wanted to share some highlights of my recent service.

Due to my broad experience in transportation issues, my contacts with the GGBHTD, and my expertise in transportation, public contracting, and infrastructure, I received very key Committee appointments that have served Marin very well. I am a current member of the Building and Operations Committee, the Transportation Committee, as well as the Labor Advisory Committee. All of Marin's projects go through these committees, and I've managed to support Marin through my service.

While not an exhaustive list, a few recent highlights of my work include:

- Fought for reinstatement of GGT 114, and specifically asked for reinstatement of bus service on Tiburon Boulevard between Tower Drive and East Strawberry Drive
- Strongly supported a Bicycle Safety Study for Alexander Avenue
- Strongly supported a Bus Coach Operator Apprenticeship Program With College of Marin
- Supported more outreach to San Rafael elected officials and community regarding the San Rafael Transit Center
- Spoke out against herbicide use on district-owned property
- Made reduction of GHG emissions and Climate Change a top priority.

The District is still facing greatly reduced revenues due to decreased ridership during the pandemic. I've worked to help navigate the District through the post-pandemic era and strategize replacement of toll, ferry, and bus revenues. However, there is more work to be done. Ridership has not reached its pre-pandemic levels, and we must focus on getting ridership back, but also look at new revenue sources to support District service.

I would be honored to continue to serve and I respectfully request your vote.
