Excerpt from MCCMC By-Laws related to City Selection Committee, as amended March 2018:

#### **ARTICLE V**

#### Committees/Authority Assignments

#### Section 1. Standing Committees:

a. <u>Legislative Committee</u>: The Legislative Committee shall consist of a Councilmember from each of the member cities, chosen by their respective City Councils, one city manager and one alternate city manager. Its duties shall be to review pending Federal and State legislation affecting cities and to take a position on the legislation consistent with a vote of the majority of the committee and the authority given the committee by MCCMC policies.

- b. <u>Executive Committee</u>: The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President and the most immediate Past-President who is a member. It shall serve in an advisory capacity to the President to help plan and organize the activities of the COUNCIL.
- Mayors Select Committee: The Mayors Select Committee shall consist of the Mayor, or C. his/her designated representative from among each member's council, from each of the member cities and the Executive Committee of MCCMC. Its duties will be to form a consensus on and a recommended advocacy action for citywide and/or regional issues that directly and immediately affect all member cities and for which there is no other appropriate forum. The Mayors Select Committee shall also perform the functions of the City Selection Committee (relating to certain appointments and nominations) and under the powers vested by and pursuant to Cal. Gov't Code §50270 et seq. The Mayors Select Committee shall meet annually in April or at the first reasonably convenient time thereafter, and its Chair will be the President of MCCMC. Executive Committee members may be present but may not cast votes on City Selection Committee matters except when designated as described above. The President of MCCMC will report on the actions or recommendations of the Mayors Select Committee at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the COUNCIL, and shall call for a full vote of any recommended advocacy actions.

SUBJECT: Marin County Council of Mayors and Council Members – Member Appointment

Dear Ms. Vaughn,

The Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 states the composition of the Local Agency Formation Commissions (LAFCo) shall generally include seven regular members that includes county (two), city (two), special district (two), and public (one) representation. Each represented category also has an alternate.

MCCMC appointments for two LAFCo seats, Councilmember Sashi McEntee (regular seat) and Councilmember Barbara Coler (alternate seat), are set to expire in May 2020. I know MCCMC has a multiple meeting process to nominate and select the person to serve, so I wanted to give you time to go through your process. These two seat's terms expire in May 2024.

In addition, LAFCo has been made aware that Councilmember Sloan Baily will not be seeking reelection for another term to the Corte Madera Town Council. Once he no longer serves in that capacity, he cannot continue his term as a Member on the Commission. He is set to leave office on or before April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020, based on when the election gets certified. Once the election gets certified the seat will become vacant. Therefore, LAFCo requests that the MCCMC makes an appointment to fill the vacancy for the Regular Member seat which will serve the remainder of that seat's term, May 2022.
