Call to Order 28 President Melissa Blaustein called the business meeting to order at 6:00p.m., and welcomed everyone 29 to the meeting of the Marin County Council of Mayors and Councilmembers, for January 24, 2024. 30 31 A roll call of the Marin towns/cities was taken. There was a quorum of the 11 Marin cities/towns present, 32 with representatives from the 11 Marin cities/towns in attendance. President Blaustein then called for 33 Public Comment. 34 35 2. Public Comment: 36 a. Pat Eklund, Novato: She spoke about her ABAG report and asked that elected officials review it (it can be viewed here) particularly the portions about Horizontal Levees, under the 37 38 Nature-Based Shoreline Strategies), which are gently sloping, vegetated slopes that can 39 provide multiple benefits including: protection against storms and rising sea levels; habitat 40 for native species; and recreational and educational opportunities; Regional Housing Technical Assistance Program, Marin received \$490,000 in funding support for planning 41 collaboratives; and Plan Bay Area 2050, where she noted that the draft Regional Growth 42 Forecast anticipates lower population and household growth between 2020 and 2050 than 43 44 in Plan Bay Area 2050: the estimated population growth is 1.8 million while household 45 growth is 1.0 million, 23% and 22% lower than the previous forecast, respectively. Meanwhile, estimated jobs growth is 1.4 million, similar to the previous forecast. 46 47

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52 53 b. Kate Colin, San Rafael: Announced that elected officials should have received an email announcing an opportunity to participate in Marin LEO, the Marin Leadership for Equity and Opportunity for Elected Officials. It's a free leadership program. The program is about getting tools and formats for really looking at all the sticky problems that we work on day in and day out and collaborating with other folks who are also in public service. - d. Lori Frugoli, District Attorney: Spoke about three important meetings and initiatives. Thursday, 1/25 at the Jonas Center Dr. Michael Pritchard and Mark Dale will speak about opioid abuse and Fentanyl in particular. On Friday, 1/26 at 10:30, the Coalition to End Human Trafficking is presenting a training with a very experienced investigator from Pittsburgh via zoom. They will be discussing human trafficking in the Bay Area and also how it touches Marin as well because it is happening under our noses and he's going to give some things you can look at to educate yourselves. You can learn about upcoming meetings here https://www.mcceht.org/events; and finally, the Gun Safety Collaborative will be having its first meeting of the year on Monday, 1/29 at 1:30pm and will include a presentation from Kara Connors of the Suicide Prevention Collaborative who will be speaking about coordination between the two collaboratives to prevent firearm suicides as well as sharing information about suicidality and local resources.

MarinCAN is a unique public and non-profit partnership and has a rich, ongoing history of Board Member representation from Marin County climate change agencies, city/town staff, and elected officials.

There is value to joining the MarinCAN Board, both for the individual joining and benefits for the MarinCAN Board and broader MarinCAN ecosystem, including

- Further shared climate- and community-aligned goals;
- Connect with other agencies/programs efficiently;
- Touchpoint and gain visibility on report outs from MarinCAN's endorsed solutions
- Coordinate and leverage efforts (such as fundraising, joint grant applications, program support, outreach and community engagement); and
- Use MarinCAN as a collaborative hub to further own related work.

Information on recusals and Board Member responsibilities

- Board Members serve in their individual capacity, not as a formal representative of their agency or elected position.
- Board Members who have a conflict of interest based on their position may recuse themselves from 1) fundraising responsibilities, 2) votes on specific Board resolutions, 3) involvement in specific advocacy work or letters of support.

Note: MarinCAN does not expect city/agency staff to bring back the intentions of MarinCAN to their positions. Instead, we welcome city/agency staff and elected officials to bring their knowledge and

experience in their roles to the MarinCAN Board.
